Minutes

1. Welcome and apologies (AHR)

The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting. Apologies were received from Paul Brown, Tim Venables and Angela Williams.

2. Minutes and matters arising from the last meeting (AHR)

The minutes of the last meeting were deemed to be an accurate record of discussions. It was noted that all actions from the last meeting were either in progress or would be followed up at today's meeting.

3. Technical Staff Representatives for EDI Forum and Imperial Artworks Group (AHR)

Members were invited to consider candidates for Technical Staff Representatives to the <u>EDI Forum</u> and <u>Imperial Artworks Group</u>. Ji Young Yoon (Bioengineering), the current Representative to both Groups, would be leaving College in December to take up a new role at Queen Mary University of London as Technical Facilities Manager. The Steering Group recorded its thanks to Ji and wished her well.

The Chair explained that the <u>EDI Forum</u> acted as a 'listening post' to capture and discuss EDI issues and that representatives were approachable by anyone in College. The Forum met once a term to identify issues for escalation to the College's EDI Strategy Group. Aneesha Bhumber (Teaching Laboratories Technician, Faculty of Medicine Centre and Imperial 600 member) had expressed an interest in the role and the Steering Group fully supported her nomination.

The Steering Group then considered representation for the <u>Imperial Artworks Group</u>, a new committee which met once a term to ensure that Imperial's diverse staff and students were being reflected through the artwork on display. Miguel Hermida Ayala (Biosciences Core Facilities Manager, Bioengineering) has expressed an interest in joining the group. KK, Miguel's line manager, supported his nomination and it was agreed by all that he should succeed Ji.

It was agreed that Aneesha and Miguel would serve for one academic year in the first instance.

4. Discussion: Nomination of Technicians for External Award Schemes (All)

A discussion took place on how to nominate Imperial technicians for external award schemes. It was agreed that the Steering Group would not write or submit nominations centrally but would proactively encourage Departments to nominate individuals from their areas (since they best knew their technicians and their achievements). However, AHR would provide support and guidance with the process of writing citations, as necessary.

Ahead of the meeting, a list of the technical staff recipients of internal staff recognition awards in 2022 had been circulated to the Steering Group. It was agreed that AHR should contact the Departments of all recipients listed to make them aware of the Papin Prizes, a series of national awards that publicly recognised technical excellence in academia. The Group also identified several additional candidates for the Papin Prize 'Newcomer' category from among the College's technical apprentices.

A more general discussion followed on supporting technical staff to grow their networks and connect with others across College. RP highlighted that smaller group settings could be helpful in this regard. OK spoke about some training that had been provided to his ICT apprentices on networking skills (delivered by Janine Waldman and coordinated by AHR); it was agreed that a similar session might be useful for the technical community.
