Active in the profession he is a Fellow and former member of Council of the Royal Academy of Engineering, an Honorary Fellow and former President of the Institution of Engineering and Technology, an Honorary Fellow of the Institution of Chemical Engineers, a Fellow and Trustee Board Member for the Royal Aeronautical Society and a commissioner of the Royal Commission for the Exhibition of 1851.
